

What is meant by the Kindertransport as opposed to the Holocaust?

The Kindertransport

In the months between the Kristallnacht Pogrom of November 9-10, 1938, and the start of World War II, nearly 10,000 children were sent, without their parents, out of Nazi Germany, Austria, Poland and Czechoslovakia to safety in Great Britain.

These children were saved by the Kindertransport rescue movement.



The Holocaust

The attempt by the Nazi regime and its collaborators to murder all of European Jewry during the Second World War [June 1941 onwards]. This genocidal policy can be seen to have evolved during the war as the Nazi regime gained more territory, and as more Jewish people came under their control. It culminated in the so called 'Final Solution', the murder of six million Jewish men, women and children.



THE NATIONAL HOLOCAUST CENTRE AND MUSEUM What do students know and understand about the Holocaust? Evidence from English secondary schools [UCL, 2015]

Highlights

□ 9,500 students participated, 14% were Year 7 pupils.

- 28.5% said they had learnt about the Holocaust in school before Year 7.
- 70% said they had seen the film 'The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas'

Misconceptions

- 9% correctly identified that the German population who were Jewish in 1933 was less than 1%.
- □ 30% knew how many Jewish people were murdered during the Holocaust
- □ 10% said they understood what the term 'anti-Semitism' meant
- 60% [highest response] named Hitler as solely responsible for the Holocaust.
- 20% [lowest response] referred to the Nazis as being responsible for the Holocaust, whilst 10% referred to Germans.
- □ 20% correctly identified that the Holocaust took place in Poland.
- Over 60% incorrectly stated that someone would be shot for disobeying a direct order to kill Jewish people.




