Private car

You are strongly advised to use public transport. Midland Road is now a one-way clearway (southbound only).

There is no parking for the public on site. There are car parks in Marchmont Street under the Brunswick Shopping Centre and on Judd Street (NCP, open Monday-Friday 6.30-18.30). Metered parking is available on Ossulston Street (3 spaces). There are also some disabled parking spaces in Judd Street opposite the Library.

Bicycles

There is extensive bicycle parking with secure 'Sheffield stands' in covered and uncovered areas in the Piazza. Luggage can be stored free (£1 returnable deposit) in the Locker Room. The nearest cycle shop is approximately 1,500m (a mile) south, along Gray's Inn Road.

Luggage policy

The largest item you can bring into the building is the standard airline 'carry on' size, i.e. 56cm (h) X 45cm (w) X 25cm. You can bring up to two pieces of luggage into the Library.

When You Arrive

The registration desk will be situated outside the Harry M Weinrebe Learning Centre. Through the main entrance, this is on the lower ground floor to the right of the cloakrooms. You may use the cloakrooms to store belongings, but this will close at 8pm and all belongings are left at your own risk. Being that the learning centre normally hosts sessions for children, there is a secure electronic pass entry system to the rooms. You will need to be escorted to and from the rooms by a member of staff with an electronic pass, although a selection of spare passes will be hanging up to use for comfort visits. Please return these to the hook once you have used them. Toilets are located on the lower ground floor to the right of the learning centre as you come out, or to the left as you are coming in.
