What you need to do:

Create a three-minute audio recording where you explain who is your history hero and why. You can take whatever format you wish for the presentation of your argument and can **enter as an individual or as a group**.

What you'll win:

Winning entries will be featured on the *BBC History Magazine* podcast, and the Historical Association's student zone. The individual prize winner will also receive an **Olympus LS-5 recorder** and **a year's subscription to *BBC History Magazine***, as well as a year's corporate **membership of the Historical Association** for his/her school, plus a year's individual membership.
