Specified Content	The early years of the Nazi Party; Nazi ideas and methods; the Munich Putsch; the roles of Hitler and other Nazi leaders and the change of tactics after the Putsch; the impact of the Depression on Germany; the political, economic and social crisis of 1930–33; reasons for growing support for the Nazis and the election results 1928–33; how Hitler became Chancellor in 1933; the Reichstag Fire, Hitler’s use of emergency powers, the Enabling Act of 1933.

Focus Points	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How did Germany emerge from defeat in the First World War?</li> <li>• What was the economic and political impact of the Treaty of Versailles on the Weimar Republic?</li> <li>• To what extent did the Republic recover after 1923?</li> <li>• What were the achievements of the Weimar period?</li> </ul>
Specified Content	The Revolution of 1918-19 and the establishment of the Republic; the impact of the Treaty of Versailles on German politics and the German economy; the Weimar Constitution; the political disorder of 1920-3; economic distress and hyper-inflation; the occupation of the Ruhr; the Stresemann era – recovery at home and abroad; underlying weaknesses of the Republic; cultural achievements of the Weimar period.
