2.6 Views of parents and Media: How effectively do the views of parents and media support improvements in history provision?

As a school we are going for 'The Leading Parent


Partnership Award' (LPPA) which is a national


award that provides a coherent framework for

schools, early years settings and other educational




organisations that delivers effective parental engagement from early years to post-16.
