When you arrive at Leeds Trinity, please go to the main entrance foyer (1 on map below), where someone will be waiting to register you and direct you to the Trinity Building.

By train

Leeds Trinity is approximately one mile from Horsforth station, four miles from Apperley Bridge Station and seven miles from Leeds Train Station.

From Leeds train station you can catch a connection to **Horsforth**, which is 5-10 minutes' walk from the University. On leaving the station, turn right. Walk past a parade of shops to your right until you reach a roundabout and the Old Ball pub. Turn right onto Brownberrie Lane and continue until you see Leeds Trinity on your left-hand side. Alternatively, a free shuttle bus runs frequently from a stop opposite the station (outside the sandwich shop).

A taxi to the University from Leeds station will cost between £11-14 each way and is a roughly 20 minute journey.

By bus

Leeds Trinity is served by buses between Leeds city centre and Horsforth. The 97 bus stops outside the campus entrance and can take you into the centre of Leeds via Headingley.

Alternatively, the number 50 and 50A bus services stop about a 15-minute walk from campus and can take you into Leeds via Kirkstall and Burley. The number 6 bus service stops at Horsforth train station and travels into Leeds via Headingley.

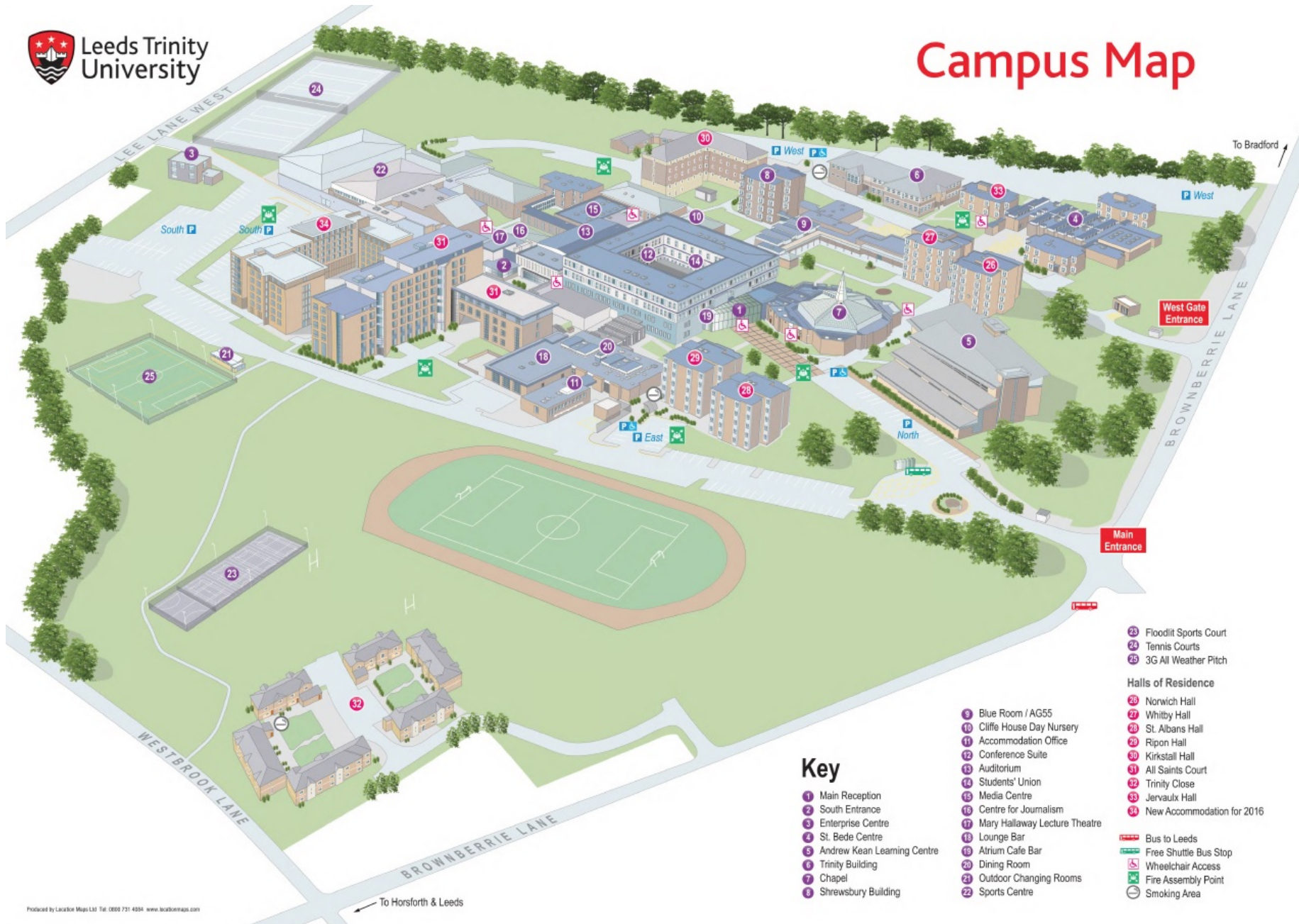
By car
