SESC Education and Social Change Historian Videos

Each video comprises a historian discussing their research on education and social change, as well as explaining how they approach a series of primary sources. Our hope is that the videos introduce students and teachers to ongoing, cutting-edge research in the field of post-1945 British history. Secondly, the videos are intended to build students' confidence when analysing primary sources and consolidate key skills by showing how university-based historians go through the same process when developing their historical claims and interpretations.
