THE object of this School is to receive the Children of the Labouring Class from the age of eighteen months to six years ; to provide for their health and safety ; to give them instruction and employment ; and to open their tender minds to good impressions and kind feelings ; for, even at this early age, Children may be taught easy and simple lessons, trained to habits of order and obedience, and led to look up to their God and Saviour, as a constant Protector and Benefactor, with feelings of gratitude and love.

It is particularly recommended to the consideration of parents who are engaged in daily labour, and who are on that account unable to attend closely to their Children, whether the opportunity of having them taken care of and instructed, would not only be a great advantage to themselves, but also of lasting benefit to their offspring ; and such parents are especially invited to visit the School, in order that they may observe the order and happy appearance of the Children, which cannot fail to convince them how much better it is for them to be at School, than to be idle at home, or running about the Streets, as many do, to the danger both of their health and morals.
